Middle and Senior College parents should have received an email about the Mindstar program that will be conducted at the college next term. This program, developed by Mr Aaron Williams in conjunction with the University of the Sunshine Coast and the University of Queensland, provides a series of online sessions that equip young people with strategies to think calmly, find places of stillness, reduce negative self-talk and identify values. It is a pilot program focused on enhancing young people's sense of wellbeing that will also provide online support with trained psychologists if needed. This is an exciting innovation for the college led by Mr Brendan Delaney. Parents of children in any year level are invited to attend an information session on Thursday, 26th March where Mr Aaron Williams will share the online materials that the Middle and Senior College students will work through. Parents will then have the opportunity to provide feedback about the program. We look forward to this exciting innovation making a difference for young people and their families in the coming weeks.

There was a great buzz around the college on Saturday morning as the Club PLC Soccer and Caloundra Netball Association held their games at the college. It was great to

see the college being able to support our local community in such a visible way. Thank you to all those parents from our soccer and netball clubs who helped the day to run extremely smoothly. Daily Bread

St Patricks Day

People know that St Patrick is associated with Ireland. People know that St Patrick is acclaimed as the man who drove the snakes out of Ireland and he is called the 'Patron Saint' of that land. What is not commonly known about St Patrick, is his enormous influence on Christian schooling.

Patrick and his followers established places of learning right across Ireland. People today call them monasteries but they were actually more like schools in our modern sense. In Patrick's schools, young people and teenagers were instructed in basic literacy and numeracy, along with Biblical studies, leadership and citizenship.

As this "schools movement" spread across Ireland and Wales, it flourished and then spread into Europe. A map of Continental Europe from the early middle ages will show the locations of the many new places of learning that the Irish and Welsh educators established, as they carried their "mission to teach" across their known world. Many, many of the great European university towns of our modern era, were actually begun as Celtic schools. Both Martin Luther's home university town Erfurt, as well as his place of work, the university town of Wittenberg were originally Celtic Colleges established by the Irish and Welsh.

So, in a very real way, St Patrick's Day is also a celebration of us at Pacific. We are people who have received from St Patrick's tradition, a commitment to quality education in a Community under Christ ... For that was certainly what was at the very centre of the Celtic Educational Community - life under the loving lordship of Jesus Christ.

One irony about St Patrick's work is that he did not write a lot, himself. We have only a few documents that are attributed to his own hand. One of them includes a prayer that has

encouraged and uplifted many people who have prayed the words of this world famous Christian educator:

"Christ be with me, Christ within me;
Christ before me, Christ beside me.
Christ to win me;
Christ to comfort and restore me;
Christ beneath me, Christ above me.
Christ in quiet, Christ in danger;
Christ in mouth of friend or stranger.
Christ in hearts of all that love me.
Christ be with me."

Year 3-12 Cross Country – 2nd April

On the last day of this term (2nd April), all Year 3-12 students will be participating in the Inter House Cross Country Carnival. Students will compete in age groups from 8 years through to open boys/girls. The 8 - 12 years events will take place from 10.45am - 1.00pm and the 13 years - open races will go from approximately 1.30pm - 3.00pm.

This year, in the 13 years - open age divisions, we will be running the carnival in a slightly different format. There will be two events on the day:

1. **The Championship Event**, which involves those who are serious runners who want to compete for Age Championship medallions, a spot in the school team and for extra House Points. There are big points up for grabs to all who compete in this race. 1st receives 30 points, 2nd 25 points etc, all the way down to 9th – 15th receiving 5 points. Each house MUST field five runners from each age group and gender. This event will be run as one single race, but scored per age group.

2. **House Participation Event**, whereby ALL other students who are not running in the Championship Event will run a 3km course. The first House that gets a certain number of runners across the line will receive 200 house points (2nd gets 150 and 3rd gets 100). Then, all other runners who cross the line within 25 minutes also receive a house point. Therefore, it is important that ALL students participate and run to the best of their ability.

It is compulsory for all students to attend and participate in the cross country event.

- Medical - Disinfectant, antiseptic (Dettol), bandaids, bandages, cotton wool, Panadol, insect repellent (non-aerosol), mosquito coils, mosquito nets.

- Food - Canned foods, non-perishable foods, cooking pots, non-breakable crockery.
- Cooking - Cooking pots, non-breakable crockery, kitchen and eating utensils.
- Linen - sheets, towels, washers, tea-towels, blankets, sleeping bags, lightweight tents or ground sheets.
- Tools - Batteries, buckets, hammers, saws, screw drivers, nails, screws, rope, twine, straps, tape, pegs.
- Storage - waterproof bags, boxes or containers, zip-lock bags.
- School - pencils, rubbers, exercise books.

If you are able to help out with any of these items, please bring along to the canteen this Saturday morning. Please ensure any clothing items are washed and folded, for ease of packing and for customs clearance.
