## From the Director of Students

### Year 7 Canberra Trip

The Year 7 students had a wonderful time in Canberra recently. This is what Kezia Smith and Darcy Sellick thought of the experience:

We went, we saw, we made memories . . .

Early on Sunday, 20<sup>th</sup> July the Year 7 group set off for their tour of the National Capital. At Questacon, there were lots of hands-on activities to do. My favourite (Darcy) was the vertical slide hanging from a bar then dropping 6.5m. Another good activity was the earthquake room where there was a simulation of what it would be like to be in an earthquake. There were lots of illusions in the first activity room. There were lots of cool stuff that you could buy at the store.

The next day, we went to Parliament House. We were shown around by a tour guide and we even got to sit in the green room, the House of Representatives and red room, the Senate! It was interesting and weird to think we were actually in Parliament House! We then went to the old Parliament House and got to sit in the original senate room. Then we participated in a role playing activity where we learned about how laws are passed and if it is fair how people vote.

Before we went to Canberra, we researched a World War I soldier from the Landsborough Honour Roll. When we arrived at The War Memorial, we placed a poppy beside their name on the Honour Roll wall. We had a look at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. It was a very quiet and still place. We learnt that in WW1 Germany had their valuables taken away from them. This contributed to the beginning of WW2. The Vietnam War was interesting because there seemed to be no end. It was an unpopular war with the people in Australia.

We then went to CSIRO, which stands for Commonwealth Scientific Industrial Research Organisation. There were lots of fun facts and interactive activities, all to do with science. We were shown how to extract DNA from a banana and we then had the opportunity to extract DNA ourselves from peas!

We also went to the Deep Space Centre. There were four really big dishes that communicate with satellites in space. They are like space telescopes. We got to look around and even got to see one of the satellites moving into a position,

where it could get some photos of space. Our tour guide told us all about the Mars rovers and we got to see the latest rover landing and the first photos on Mars. It was very interesting and cool to think that there are only three places like this in the world.

At the AIS, we had a funny tour guide from one of the Canberra Raiders NRL team. He showed us the volleyball courts, gym, new aquatic centre and gymnastics centre. He told us that the minimum height for a volleyball player is 6 foot 5 inches to be the short player. There is one short player in every team to get the low balls; however, the rest of the team is a minimum of seven feet tall.

The thing I enjoyed most would probably have to be the snow. (Kezia). When we arrived, we went straight up the mountain to start tobogganing. I have never been before so I was a bit nervous, but it was really fun once I had a few goes. The weather was cold on the slopes but the snow felt powdery. As the day got colder, the snow became icy and slippery. It was really cold when you fell off the toboggan onto the snow. A lot of people tried standing up on the toboggans and many failed. Mr Evans stacked a couple of times and he started a snow war. After lunch, we went back out there to enjoy the last hour of the snow. It was a long trip home.

Canberra was such a great experience and we made heaps of memories.




