Probably the first 'formal' and 'public' school building in Queensland was in Nundah. It was a little base for instructing the children of local indigenous communities and it was maintained by the first Lutheran missionaries to arrive in this state. They called their place, 'Zion's Hill' and those missionaries have left a legacy of place names such as Rode Road and Kedron Brook.

They have also left a legacy of schooling in the Lutheran Church. This year we celebrate 175 years of this work. Lutheran schools are established to help parents give children the best start in life; that they might grow to become God's blessing to others in this world.

This Friday, Pacific will be planting a memorial tree as a marker of this 175 year celebration. We asked Mr Bill Vaile about what kind of tree would be iconic for the Sunshine Coast whilst acknowledging which trees were especially significant for the original inhabitants who were first engaged by those Lutheran missionaries in the 1830s. Bill pointed us to a Bunya Pine.

So, on Friday, our students will gather outside the gym as College Council representatives, Mr Peter Hovey and Mr Russell Kleidon plant this ceremonial Bunya. As this tree grows, we pray that the people of Pacific grow in the grace and knowledge of God. We pray also that Pacific would continue its growth as a school that brings out the best in our young people.

Year 12 End of Year Events

The Year 12 Personal Development program each week for the remainder of the year will include a lesson of study and a lesson engaging students in a variety of planned activities in preparation for end of year events (alternative days and graduation events).

Last Thursday, Year 12 participated in a one-hour seminar presented by Y2K (which was organised earlier in the year). The learning intention of this seminar was to grow a deeper student understanding of the social, physical, emotional and psychological impact of substances. Particularly the focus was on neurotoxins, media and celebrity influences, substance addiction, peer pressure and choices, neurotoxin damage and the impact substances have on the brain.

Year 12 students were given practical strategies and ways to avoid or deflect peer pressure situations regarding neurotoxic substances. In Term 4, Year 12 students will be involved in other seminars and presentations during the alternative days to

continue personal development for lifelong use. **Please note: ALL Year 12 students are required (compulsory attendance) on the alternative days.**

During the holidays, I will send invitations for the Graduation Ceremony, 2014 Graduating Senior Class Formal and all information about end of year. Payment for the formal function and the RSVP for these events will be due on Friday, 17th October 2014.

It is strongly advised that students do not drive to or from their formal due to the high excitement associated with finishing school and the possible relaxed decision making processes that may be associated with this.

Parents, family and friends are invited to the Year 12 students' final chapel on Friday morning, 21st November. Families are asked to be at the college multipurpose centre by 8.15am for the chapel commencement at 8.30am. Following the chapel, the college's staff and students form a 'guard of honour'. Parents, family and friends are also invited to be part of this 'guard of honour'.

At Pacific, we have had a history of quiet, relaxed and respectful exits from their schooling by the graduating Year 12 students. I would like to take this opportunity to say that any poor behaviour by our Year 12 students towards any other Year 12 student, the college staff, the community or other schools and their students will be looked upon very dimly by the college's administration and College Council. **The college does not allow 'muck up day' type activities or sessions. Mistakes Improve Children's Learning

Everyone makes mistakes and children are no exception. What's important is how we learn from them. Yet children grow up in a society that pressures them to be perfect and intelligent - to achieve the highest OP scores, land prized scholarships and get into the best universities. Parents reinforce this pressure at home when they cover up children's mistakes, correct homework to improve grades or drill knowledge into kids until they get it right. Stress is increased when children are constantly praised for their intelligence. How does this focus on perfection and IQ affect learning? And how can we help children and teens believe in themselves by accepting their mistakes and learning from them?

Learning from Mistakes: Ten Parenting Guidelines that Foster Positive Youth Development

- Acknowledge that you do not expect them to be perfect.
- Let them know your love is unconditional, regardless of their mistakes or lapses in judgment.
- Do not rescue children from their mistakes. Instead, focus on the solution.
- Provide examples of your own mistakes, the consequences, and how you learned from them.
- Encourage them to take responsibility for their mistakes and not blame others.
- Avoid pointing out their past mistakes. Instead, focus on the one at hand.
- Praise them for their ability to admit their mistakes.
- Praise them for their efforts and courage to overcome setbacks.
- Mentor them on how to apologise when their mistakes have hurt others.
- Help them look at the good side of getting things wrong!
