A huge congratulations to three past students from Pacific who last week graduated from Qantm College and took part in a Graduate Exhibition evening for industry.

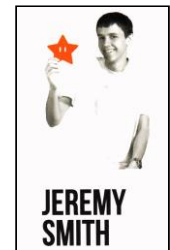
