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## Daily Bread

### Seven Heartfelt Sayings . . .

It must be very hard to dramatise the crucifixion of Jesus. This is not only because this is such an important event for so many people who worship Jesus as "Lord God with us." It must be

very hard, because Jesus did not simply die silently. Even when He was on the cross, He spoke.

His words spoken in that short time before He died are known as the seven “words” or seven “sayings” from the cross. As He speaks, Jesus reveals His heart. He is concerned that those who sin against God are forgiven. He is concerned that one sinner knows that He is loved by God and can be hopeful even when He is dying. He is compassionate to the people of His family.

But He also cries out to God for help. He grieves and longs for a better way. In His dying, He commends all that He is and all that He has done, into God’s care. This will not be the end of the story, for we know that there is soon to be an empty tomb and good news of resurrection.

As the Easter holiday weekend gathers our attention over the next days, I invite you to pause and to consider these seven words from Jesus on the cross.

1. “Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do.”
2. “Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise.” (to the thief crucified beside him).
3. “Woman, this is your son.” To his mother Mary, and then to His disciple, “This is your mother.”
4. “My God, my God, why have You forsaken Me?”
5. “I thirst.”
6. “It is finished.”
7. “Father, into Your hands I commend my spirit.”

May the heart of God enfold you, protect you and guide you and your loved ones over these days of our term holidays.



