From the Head of Teaching and Learning K-5

Developing a Classroom Culture of Thinking


In a world of rapid change, the next generation will need more than ever to be schooled in thinking skills. Programs that take them beyond basic acquisition and application of existing knowledge into the realms of creative and caring thinking will ensure that today's students will become the free-thinking adults of the 21st Century adults with the ability to create the knowledge required to take us beyond the information age.

Teachers at Pacific have learnt that in order to succeed in the 21st Century, students need to be creative, critical, collaborative and higher order thinkers. With that in mind, we are looking at the work of Ron Ritchhart from Project Zero at Harvard and exploring the creation of a "Culture of Thinking". A *Culture of Thinking* is an environment where thinking is valued, visible and actively promoted. As we build a *Culture of Thinking* among teachers, we are also establishing thinking routines from the website *Making Thinking Visible*. We are finding that the routines enrich curriculum, deepen thinking and differentiate learning.

Teachers have been sharing with me their experiences as well as student work as they use routines and add thinking walls in their classrooms.

They have found it useful to focus on one or two routines with their classes so that they truly become routines and easy to implement. As the language and thinking supported by routines become part of the culture of the classroom, the structure of the routine starts to fall away. This is when cultural forces begin to move toward supporting a *Culture of Thinking* and supports the introduction of additional routines.

Watch this space as we unpack thinking in our learning journey throughout the year!

Bundaberg Service Trip

When I commented to a friend that a team from Pacific was travelling to Bundaberg on the Easter holidays to help with the flood clean-up, his reply was "There wouldn't be much left to do up there, would there?" Given that we haven't heard a lot in the media about how Bundaberg is faring since the floods occurred in January, it is not surprising that people would make that assumption. However, it could not be further from the truth.

On the surface, it appears that the town has cleaned up quickly and is back on its feet. However, a closer look reveals a different story. Countless homes stand empty of people and belongings. Repairs have begun in a number of instances but for many people, it will be December at the earliest before they are able to move back into their houses. A large number of residents could not afford the cost of insurance and many others, frustrated with having claims refused after the last flood, decided not to continue with their policies. Many of those worst affected are from low socio economic areas and they now rely on volunteers and donations to help rebuild.

Samaritan's Purse, a Christian service organisation, has been coordinating volunteers to help those most in need. The Bundaberg churches have now banded together to assume this responsibility. We worked closely with both of these groups during the service trip.

One group from our team helped a couple to clean out a number of sheds on their property that had been inundated. They were overwhelmed that young people were willing to help complete a job that would have taken weeks for them to do on their own. Another resident of the same street kindly allowed us to walk through his severely flood damaged home, which is in the process of being gutted and cleaned. His cheerful

welcome and positive attitude, despite the huge loss he has suffered, was truly inspiring.

Another group assisted a woman in cleaning up her once beautiful garden, which after the flood was caked in toxic mud and full of weeds. They also filled in sink holes in another yard and helped a woman pack up her belongings because she has been forced to move out of her home. St John's Lutheran Kindergarten had not yet been able to open this year and we also helped weed and tidy their yard in readiness for the students who were to arrive the following Monday.



Everyone we helped was incredibly grateful for our assistance and amazed that our students voluntarily gave up three days of their holidays to help with such hard work. Spiritual and Service Pacific Action Group captains, Emma Jurecky and Michelle Kerr, were the driving force behind the trip and they and all students were shining examples of sharing Christ's love through serving others.
