You Can Do it

Japan Trip

The 2013 Japan Trip was an amazing trip filled with fun, laughter and new friendships.

We arrived back at Gold Coast International Airport on Sunday, 7th July after spending an amazing 16 days abroad. Our trip began on Saturday, 22nd June at 5.30am. From there, the 15 students and three staff members boarded their eight hour flight to Narita International Airport.

We spent two nights in Tokyo, which included a day at Disneyland. We then headed to Choushi where the students experienced their first ever onsen (hot spring) and enjoyed a traditional Japanese banquet at a ryokan (traditional Japanese Inn) and also had fun with karaoke! On Tuesday we received a great warm welcome from the students and staff at our sister school Seishin Gakuen. During the following five days, students were fully immersed into the life of a Japanese student while they home stayed with their host family and participated in traditional activities such as kendou (sword fighting), sadou (tea ceremony) and shyodou (Japanese calligraphy) with their shadow students. During our stay at Seisin, Mr Hauser and the Pacific students ran an AFL and cricket lesson and shared our Aussie sporting culture with 56 Year 10 boys.

We witnessed many tears and hugs on our last day at Seishin before our journey continued to Kyoto on the shinkansen (bullet train). We toured Kinkakuji (the Golden Shrine), Ginkakuji (the Silver Shrine) and Kiyomizu Temple (Temple of Pure Water). We also spent a day at Universal Studios Japan. On our final days, we met up with our past JTA Yuki Sensei and left our prayers at the World Heritage Peace Memorial Park in Hiroshima.

I would like to express my special thanks to all the staff, especially Mr Mark Hauser and Miss Natsuko Tokume who played a large role in the success of the 2013 Japan Trip. I would like to also thank our sister school Seishin Gakuen for their wonderful hospitality and also to our 15 students for showing their dedication to language learning and appreciation of the Japanese culture. It was a fantastic 16 days that will have a special place in the sister school relationship between Pacific and Seishin. Arigatou!

Maths Tutoring

The college wants to support students academically and again have tutorials for students in Years 7 to 12 who would like extra assistance or clarification of concepts in Mathematics. QTAC applications for the 2013-2014 admissions open on Thursday, 1st August. Year 12 students have received their QTAC Guide and instructions on how to use it. Students are encouraged to consult with the Career Counsellor before completing an application. Students can complete their application at college after the QCS Test in September. On-time applications close on Friday, 27th September. The application fee up to 27th September is \$34 and after that date it is \$109.

Courses in the study field of Creative and Performing Arts require the students to apply for an audition or submit a portfolio by a particular date, sometimes before the QTAC application closing date. These fixed closing dates are listed in the QTAC Guide. Students will be reminded of these dates in the Compass newsletter.

The application closing date for auditions for all Music programs at the University of Queensland and Griffith University (Conservatorium of Music) is Monday, 12th August.

The audition application closing date for Music at QUT is Friday, 13th September.

Students should visit the universities websites to download the application forms and details of the application.


