Daily Bread

Famous Middle Eastern Faith Leader Comes to Australia

At the end of September, Australia will welcome a Middle Eastern Leader of international renown. Bishop Munib Younan, the Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Palestine and Jordan, will be a special presenter at the Australian Conference of Lutheran Education in Brisbane.

Bishop Younan was born in Jerusalem into a family that had become Lutheran Christians. In his journey to becoming bishop, he has studied theology in Finland and in the USA (School of Theology at Chicago). Bishop Younan also received an honorary doctorate from Wartburg College in Iowa in the USA in 2001. He is very involved in the Middle East Council of Churches and interfaith dialogues and has received many awards recognising his work in peace, justice and reconciliation. In 2010, he was elected as President of the Lutheran World Federation.

In his book, *Witnessing for Peace* Bishop Younan wrote: "The essence of religion is not hatred and fear of the other.

Rather, the essence of religion is love of God and love of neighbor. ... [Right religion] is completely separate from that which is used to justify hatred, killing, and oppression of the other. ... [Right religion] combats any instigation to violence that is taught - whether taught at home, from the pulpit, in mass media, or in the public places. ... We cannot stand idle while others work to instigate hatred, attempt to undermine and undercut, work to defame, or create prejudice against any other. ... The core values of all religion are love of God and love of neighbor."

Jesus said, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbour as yourself.' Luke 10: 27.

Year 9 Challenge Camp

Last week, 72 Year 9 students, four staff and three outdoor education aides spent five days in Brooyar State Forest and the surrounding private properties in the Glastonbury district west of Gympie completing the Year 9 Challenge Camp.

The camp reflected many of the topics that the students had been discussing in their Rite Journey classes. A major emphasis was given to students to reflect on where they are at with regards to their personal development. The students completed a 24-hour Duo Camp Out. This is where two students spend 24 hours by themselves in the bush. The students had to build their own shelter using twine and two pieces of builders plastic and complete a number of tasks whilst by themselves. Next year on Year 10 camp, the students will complete a 40-hour solo.

The groups were also responsible for all aspects of daily life whilst on camp and slept either in tents or shelters they made themselves for the four nights. Other highlights included a 35m abseil at Point Pure and organising a mock Search and Rescue of a plane crash. When the students arrived at the grid co-ordinates, they found the shell of an actual Cessna plane with a dummy in it. From here they had to stretcher one of their classmates back to camp after treating their pretend injuries.

I would like to thank the staff that attended for their dedication and attention to safety whilst they were away. They have built a genuine relationship with each student in their Rite Journey class and this was very noticeable when thank you's and goodbyes were said at the end of the camp.

Mrs Melissa Pollack, our Festival Convenor, has to be congratulated for the way she brought it all together, putting in many, many hours of research and time over a period of many months.





