Are we really as deserving as we think? Sometimes, as Christians, we can be caught in this trap of seeing others as less deserving but are they really? All of us in God's eyes fall a long way short of what He would have us be. Even at our best, we are in need of God's grace and forgiveness. Jesus relayed the story of the tax collector and the Pharisee going to pray. The tax collector went forward with head bowed, hardly daring to speak while the Pharisee prayed loudly and confidently. Jesus said that God was more pleased with the prayer of the sinning tax collector. God's grace comes freely to all and we all are in deep need of it. Seeing the world in this way has us being grateful for what we are given by a gracious God and responding with a generous spirit.

Daily Bread

Jesus Prince of Peace-Making

High on a mountain, Jesus once said, "Blessed are the peace-makers." He did NOT mean "Blessed are those who 'shut up the noise' of others, so that everyone could have peace and quiet." Rather, he did mean, "Blessed are those who work for the cause of good life for all." He did mean, "Blessed are those who seek reconciliation and restoration before claiming revenge or retribution."

From the time of His death and resurrection, there have been followers of Jesus at the cutting edge of the work of peace-making in our world. William Wilberforce and John Newton were central to the end of slavery in Europe. Sojourner Truth and Mary Ann McClintock were pioneers in women's suffrage. Desmond Tutu and Mother Theresa are household names for the cause of cultural human equality.

Jesus calls us to find the pathway to peace-making by first looking into ourselves. We each know our own sin before God, yet God loves and forgives us for Jesus' sake. Jesus sends us to receive others as we have been received by God. He says, "Do not judge, and you will not be judged. Do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven. Give, and it will be given to you. A good

measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you." He also told them this parable: "Can a blind man lead a blind man? Will they not both fall into a pit? A student is not above his teacher, but everyone who is fully trained will be like his teacher. Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, 'Brother, let me take the speck out of your eye,' when you yourself fail to see the plank in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the plank out of your eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye. (Luke 6: 37 - 42).
