

Open to students in Grade 4 to 12. Entry is free.

WHAT DO I WRITE?

A short story with the title: I wonder why?

HOW LONG SHOULD MY STORY BE?

Grade 4: 300 – 500 words
Grade 5: 400 – 600 words
Grade 6: 600 – 800 words
Middle (Yrs 7 - 9): 800 – 1000 words
Senior (Yrs 9 - 12): 800 – 1000 words

Dates:

- Competition opens: 6 June
- Closing date for entries: midnight 12 September
- The Top 5 in each Grade will be notified on 10 October
- Winners will be announced at the awards night at the Innovation Centre
- USC:Sunshine Coast on 31 October at 5.00pm.

Prizes sponsored by FireFly Education:

Overall winner - Professor Gary Crew Trophy and cash prize of \$150.

Grade/Category Winners - \$50 cash and medal.

2nd Place - \$30 cash and medal

3rd Place - \$20 cash and medal

4th & 5th - \$10 cash and certificate

Judging:

Teachers will submit their entries via the Jotform website. The entries will then be judged under the auspices of the Creative Writing Program, USC:Sunshine Coast.

Entries will be judged on:

- Conformity to checklist
- Originality entries should not have been previously published
- Expression (i.e. it must be well-written)
- Imaginative content

Conditions of Entry:

- Open to schools and students on the Sunshine Coast and Hinterland, including Home School students.
- 2. One entry per student and must be the original work of the entrant.
- 3. The judges' decision is final, and no individual correspondence will be entered into.
- 4. Entries must be typed, Times New Roman 12' font, double-spaced.
- 5. Please include a word-count next to the title of your story as well as on the entry form.
- 6. Each entry must be accompanied by an entry form.
- 7. All entries to follow naming conventions on the Jotform website.
- 8. Entry form (PDF format) and entry (Word doc) must be uploaded electronically to the JotForm website at https://tinyurl.com/mvx8mc6m
- 9. PLEASE NOTE: the teachers name must be recorded. (Important because of the teacher's undertaking).

Important note on plagiarism:

Should an entrant be awarded a prize for a story found to be plagiarised, the entrant shall refund all prize money to the organisers on demand.

Checklist:

Have you filled out and completed the entry form correctly?
Have you written your name on the form?
Have you proof-read your story?
Have you written your FIRST name at the end of your story?
Have you included a word count next to the title of your story?

Once you have ticked all the above boxes submit your entry electronically to your teacher. Teachers will then submit the entries from each grade/category.

Home School students can submit their entries electronically as per the above instructions.

PLEASE NOTE: Entries submitted without a teacher's signature will be EXCLUDED from the competition.
